

Co-op residents to learn about 'Growing Green'

Bryant Gardens' energy-saving plan to be revealed at fair

WHITE PLAINS — The Bryant Gardens cooperative apartment complex will unveil a two-year plan to reduce energy consumption tomorrow at its Energy Fair and neighborhood picnic.

City residents are invited to the event, which will feature experts from Hudson Valley Energy Consultants, Consolidated Edison, the state Energy Research and Development Authority and others who will present information on ways to save energy. Bryant Gardens residents can also exchange two incandescent light bulbs for two

compact fluorescent bulbs, which last longer, use less energy and give off more light.

Visitors can also find out if they qualify for the state's EmPower New York program, which offers audits, training, lighting and refrigerator replacement at no cost to income-qualified Con Ed customers who live in multifamily buildings.

Information on the co-op's "Growing Green" plan, including upgrades to windows, insulation, lighting and heating will be available at the fair.

Refreshments will be served and there will be entertainment for the kids.

The fair is scheduled for 2 to 5 p.m. at the co-op, located on Bryant Avenue.
